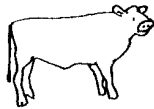


Where does it come from?

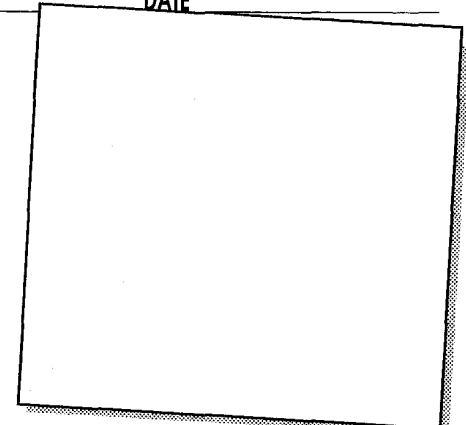

Almost four hundred years ago, people called Pilgrims came to America on a ship called the *Mayflower*. They settled where Plymouth, Massachusetts is today. They built a great big house where they all could live.

When fall came, they had warm houses and food to last all winter. They were thankful. They invited their Native American friends to a big feast. The tables were loaded with corn, venison, wild turkey, berries, clams, bread and more. They may have even had popcorn!

The first winter was long and cold. Many Pilgrims got sick and died. But when spring came, those who were left built log houses and a town hall. They hunted wild animals and planted vegetables.
